otes about the Super 8 footage taken by Ed von Renouard at Honeysuckle Creek during or immediately after the Apollo 11 Moonwalk. It was found in 2005.

There are some good things about this footage – but it is only Super 8!

Here are the drawbacks -

- The Honeysuckle picture is softer than that from Goldstone and Parkes.
- it's Super 8 and the brightest areas are washed out (e.g. the flag).
- it's hand-held.
- it has some reflections of lights and equipment behind Ed as he films.
- the segments are short.
- it has undergone triple scan conversion:
 10 fps → 30fps on the Honeysuckle scan converter → 18 fps Super 8 → 25fps PAL scan done for us at the BBC.

But here are the good things about it -

- it's the **only motion recording we know of showing the TV before it left the station**, therefore it doesn't have the video smearing / whatever that was caused by the cumulative effect of the video amps on the line up to Sydney.
- it's the **only recording we have of both PLSS backpacks and the garbage bag** being dumped down the ladder just before the TV is turned off (2.5 hours after the EVA ended). I have seen one very poor quality recording of one of the backpacks being dumped, but this appears to be the only recording of the full thing.
- Even though the video has been through a triple scan conversion, the segment prior to the first step, short though it is, still has more detail than the other recordings I have seen.
- The detail visible on some segments (esp Buzz climbing back up the ladder) is very good
 there's good shadow detail esp on the LM.

What's on the Honeysuckle Creek Super 8 footage

Except for some brief shots of the Slow Scan monitor, Ed filmed the Scan Converted monitor.
