INSTRUMENTED AIRCRAFT VISITS TO HONEYSUCKLE CREEK FOR APOLLO

1967

The first visit by a Goddard Space Flight Center Instrumented Aircraft, a Lockheed C-121G Super Constellation [**NASA 421**] to fly engineering tests with Honeysuckle Creek (HSK) occurred on **January 9, 1967**.

The aircraft based out of Sydney. Reports show test flights were performed on 9, 10, 11, 12, 16 [scrubbed due to weather], 17, and 23.

At the end of tests on the 23rd, HSK requested the aircraft land at Canberra for Tidbinbilla and Honeysuckle personnel to view the aircraft and its equipment. Comments by the aircraft crew in the report indicated that they did not appreciate the Australian black flies at Canberra's airport ;-). This probably helped ensure that all operations with the NASA aircraft would base out of Sydney in the future.

The final day of tests occurred on 27 January, when the aircraft flew 4 hours + 15 minutes. The report indicated that testing was complete as far as possible with the current status of the station.

The NASA Test Conductor was David 'Dave' Pine.

No other NASA or Contractor personnel were listed in the report.

The next Instrumented Aircraft visit to HSK was NASA 421 again from July 3–8, 1967.

The report only provided the names of the Bendix Flight Crew. Unable to determine who the NASA Test Conductor was, or if additional test or simulations personnel visited the station. Purpose of visit not specified in report. My best guess is that **George Harris**, Jr. was the **Test Conductor**.

This appears to have been the first formal simulation with Bendix Simulation Team Members on site.

The NASA Simulation Conductor was George Harris.

1968

HSK received a visit from **NASA 421 on May 2, 1968** to deliver priority cargo for both HSK and Orroral Valley stations.

The next Instrumented Aircraft visit was July 2–8, 1968 with NASA 421.

The NASA Simulation Conductor was James 'Jim' Kennedy.

The report indicates that the aircraft only flew on July 5 and 6.

The final Instrumented Aircraft visit for this year was during **November 14–28, 1968** with **NASA 421** for the purpose of conducting simulations for the **Apollo 8** mission.

The NASA Simulations Conductor was Otto Womack * who was also the Branch Head. Francis 'Frank' Glynn was the NASA Aircraft Coordinator, and also Head of the Aircraft Operations Section.

During flight operations supporting the Apollo simulations on November 26, the Power Recovery Turbine (PRT) on the No. 1 engine failed, resulting in the need for a new engine. Another Goddard aircraft, a **Douglas C-54G, NASA 427**, brought the replacement engine to Sydney.

1970

Only one trip to Honeysuckle Creek was recorded for this year with the Instrumented Aircraft. **NASA 421** and the simulations team worked with HSK from **December 1–7, 1970**.

This was the first all NASA simulations team to visit HSK. Activities were performed in preparation for the **Apollo 14** mission.

James Costrell from GSFC was also on this trip to discuss financial matters with stations senior personnel.

A group of eight passengers were also listed on the manifest without any explanation of their purpose.

A second flight crew, consisting of Capt. William 'Bill' Morgan *, Chief Bendix Pilot, Capt. Paul 'Stubby' Hendrickson, and Flight Engineer Carol 'Bud' Weddington were also on the passenger manifest. I believe they were meeting the NASA Calibration Aircraft, NASA 428, to relieve another crew.

The first trip of the Instrumented Aircraft to Honeysuckle Creek for the **Apollo 16** mission covered **April 28 – March 5, 1972**. Once again the aircraft was **NASA 421**.

Additional personnel for this visit included LCRU TV engineers, J. Miller (NASA) and J. Feltus (RCA).

Flight activities were uneventful during the HSK sims, but a loss of engine No. 4 after the conclusion of the Carnarvon simulations on **March 13** required a new engine to be flown in from the States. This complicated the remainder of our simulations schedule, but all objectives were accomplished with Goldstone prior to the launch of **Apollo 16**.

A Honeysuckle Creek technician, **Hardy (Robert) Dey**, was approved to fly with the simulation team from Canberra to Perth.

Prior to arriving in Australia we were performing simulations at Guam (GWM) when word was received that the Instrumented Aircraft support would be terminated upon our return to the USA. To say this was not a happy time would be the understatement of all time, however, we still had Carnarvon, and Honeysuckle Creek on the schedule for **Apollo 17** simulations.

Since this was the final trip overseas for the Constellations, the aircrew and simulation team members went all out on a buying spree at the Guam Base Exchanges. Checkbooks, FooNicks, and Credit Cards were well used, and the empty cargo space in **NASA 421** was put to good use.
